How to Register

Online registration is available to SSU students via MySSU at login.sonoma.edu. Online registration will be unavailable after May 20. To register for classes after that date, you will need to contact the School of Extended and International Education (SEIE) office to register.

Maximum Units

Summer Session courses offer SSU students "units in residence," the same as courses taken during the academic terms. Students may enroll in a maximum of 8 units in any one session, with a maximum of 16 units during the Summer Session term.

Course Prerequisites

Course prerequisites are listed in the SEIE online catalog (sonoma.education/sum22catalog).

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all course prerequisites are met prior to registering for a class. Failure to meet course prerequisites cannot be accepted as a justification for a refund of fees.

Fees

Undergraduate course base fee \$350/unit. Graduate-level course base fee \$400/unit. Additional fees may apply. Please see the SEIE online catalog at sonoma.education/sum22catalog for individual course fees.

Open Door Registration

Open Door registration for non-SSU students is available by contacting SEIE. See contact info under "How to Register" section. Open Door registration closes at the end of late registration for each session. Fees are due at the time of registration. Permission of instructor is required in order to register after a class has begun.

Financial Aid Information

If you received financial aid for the 2021-2022 academic year, you may be eligible for additional financial aid for our summer classes. Notification of Eligibility for Summer Financial Aid

Financial Aid will contact you via your Seawolf email account to inform you of your financial aid options. If you are not eligible for enough financial aid to pay your full summer course fees, you must pay the difference by the published due dates.

Payment

Payment can be submitted online via MySSU. For students who enroll via MySSU, payment for all sessions is due May 20, 2022. For students who enroll after May 20, payment is due at the time of enrollment.

Drop and Refund Information

SSU students may drop courses via MySSU until the day before classes begin. All students must contact SEIE to drop a class after it has started. Open door students may drop courses by contacting SEIE. See contact info under "How to Register."

Drop/Refund Dates

Refunds are calculated based on the drop date.

4-week session classes:

- 100% refund if course(s) are dropped before the first day of the session.
- 65% refund if course(s) are dropped by the second day of the session.
- No refunds if course(s) are dropped on or after the third day of the session.

12-week session classes:

- 100% refund if course(s) are dropped before the first day of the class.
- 65% refund if course(s) are dropped before 25% of the class is completed.
- No refunds if course(s) are dropped after 25% of the class is completed.
