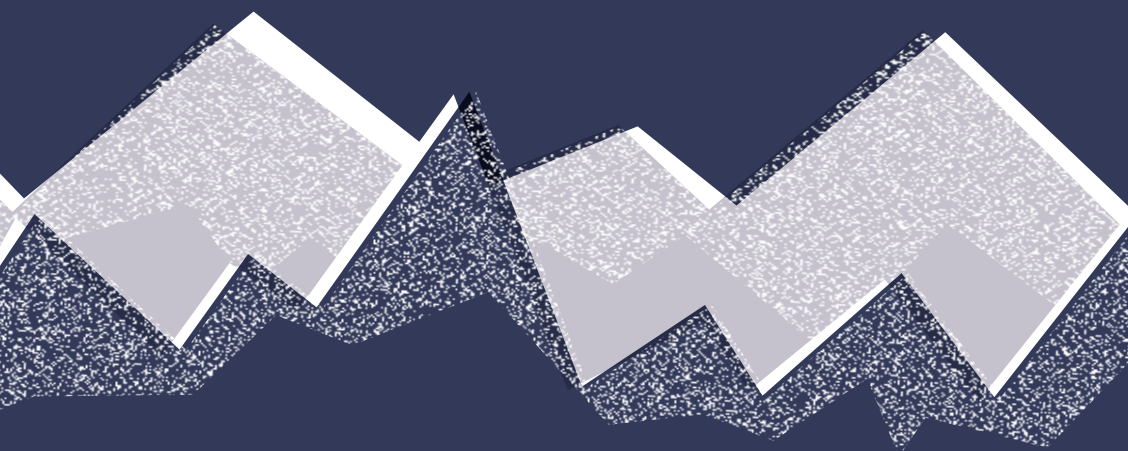

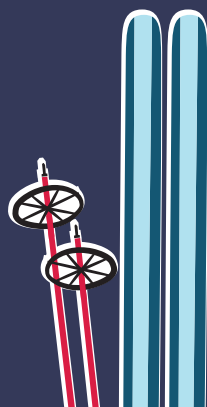

Maximum Units

Winter Intercession courses offer SSU students “units in residence,” the same as courses taken during the academic terms. Students may enroll in a maximum of 5 units during Winter Intercession.

General Education Requirements

Some Intercession courses fulfill General Education (“GE”) requirements. Look for the specific GE categories in the “GE” columns.

General Education requirements depend on catalog year. For information on your GE requirements, please visit your Academic Requirements Report (ARR) or the Intercession schedule of courses in MySSU. We recommend consulting an academic advisor when choosing your Intercession courses.

Course Prerequisites

Any course prerequisites are listed in the School of Extended and International Education (SEIE) online catalog: sonoma.education/winter22courses

It is the student’s responsibility to ensure that all course prerequisites are met prior to registering for a class. Failure to meet course prerequisites cannot be accepted as a justification for a refund of fees.

Fees

The Winter Intercession course base fee is \$325/unit. Additional fees may apply. See the SEIE online catalog at sonoma.education/winter22courses for individual course fees.

‘Open Door’ for High School & Non-SSU Students

During Winter Intercession, SSU opens its door to high school students, non-SSU college students, and working professionals. We invite you to come and study on our beautiful campus. No formal admission is required. Open Door registration for some courses is subject to the approval of the associated academic department.

How to Register

Registration is available to SSU students online via MySSU from October 13 through January 3 (no registration December 11–15). Late registration will be January 4 through 6, either in person at the School of Extended and International Education (SEIE) in International Hall or by telephone at 707-664-2394. Registration closes on January 6. Permission from instructor is required to register after January 4.

Registration is available to Open Door students October 14–January 6 in person at the SEIE Office in International Hall 100 or by phone at 707-664-2394. Permission from instructor is required to register after the first class meeting.

The SEIE office will be closed for winter break between December 24 and January 3.

Registration assistance for students with disabilities is available. Students may contact the Disability Services for Students (DSS) office at 707-664-2677 (dial 711 for Relay), or email disability.services@sonoma.edu.

Payment

SSU students may submit payment online via MySSU. Non-SSU students will be provided with payment instructions upon registration.

- For SSU students who enroll by December 10, fees are due on December 10.
- For SSU students who enroll between December 16 and January 3, fees are due on January 3.
- For SSU students who enroll January 4-6, payment is due at the time of enrollment.
- For non-SSU (Open Door) students, payment is due at the time of enrollment.

Financial Aid Information

If you would like to defer your Winter Intersession fees and use a portion of your Spring 2022 financial aid, you must fill out the Use of Financial Aid to Defer Fees Approval Form, available in our office or online. You will receive an email via your Seawolf account letting you know if your Deferral has been approved or not. If your deferment is not approved, you will be required to pay your fees by the stated deadlines. All deferment forms must be received by SEIE by December 8, 2021.

GPS Scholarships

SEIE will be awarding a limited number of need-based, \$500 GPS scholarships for Winter Intersession. Applications will be available starting October 13, 2021, and must be submitted online no later than 11:59 p.m. on November 29, 2021. Late applications will not be accepted. Drop and Refund Information

Courses can be dropped via MySSU through January 4, or by contacting SEIE by 4 p.m. on January 4.

Refunds are calculated based on the drop date:

- A 100% refund is granted for classes dropped by January 4, 2022.
- A 65% refund is granted for classes dropped January 6, 2022.
- No refunds are granted for classes dropped after January 6, 2022.

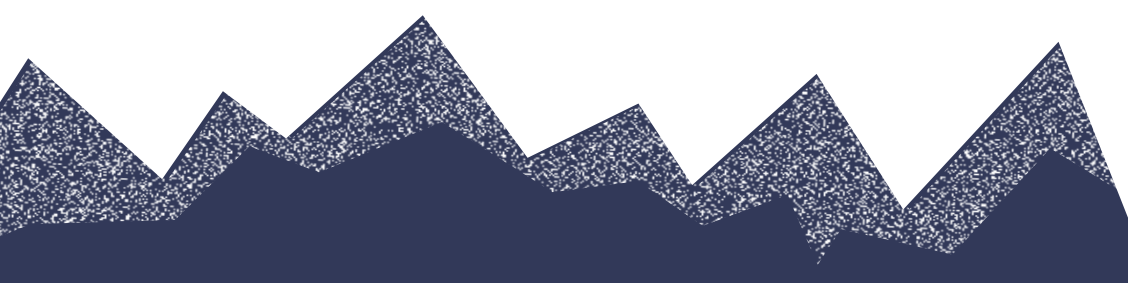

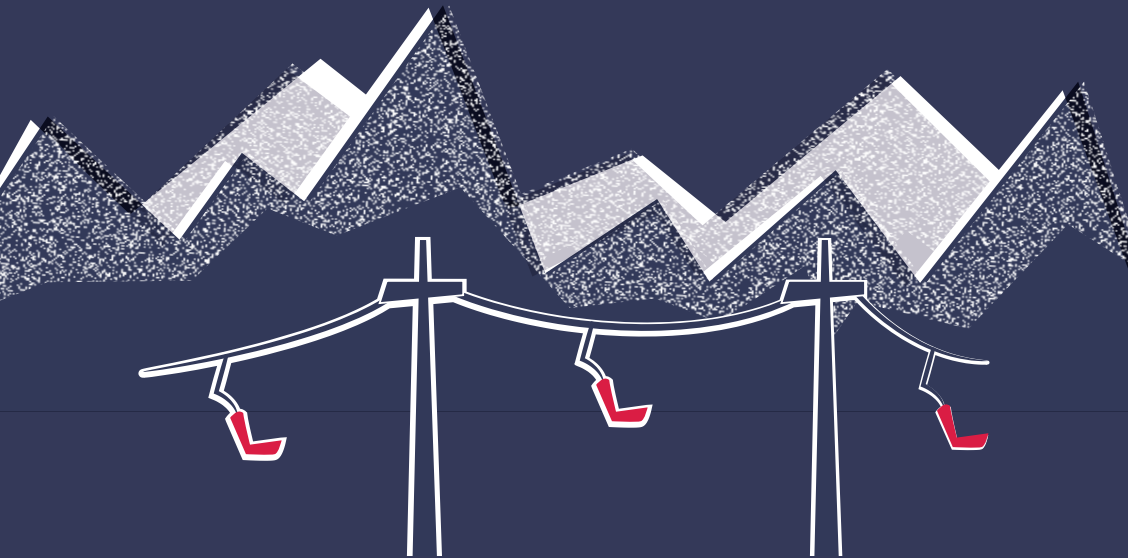
\$500 SCHOLARSHIP for Intercession

In order to be considered for an SEIE scholarship, you must:

- Be a matriculated, undergraduate SSU student in good academic standing.
- Be enrolled in a Winter Intercession class for 3 or more units.
- For the GPS scholarship, have filed a FAFSA or a Dream Act application with SSU FOR THE 2021-2022 academic year.
